We would like to make you aware of a unique opportunity to join with the City of McCall in making its Centennial a memory, literally etched in stone.

McCall was incorporated on July 19, 1911. To celebrate our 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, a city-wide celebration and BBQ will occur on July 19, 2011. Subsequent to that birthday party there are two significant projects that will take place.

First, the McCall Centennial Committee will be producing a historical book entitled: 100 years of Living, Loving and Laughing in McCall. This hard bound, numbered limited edition of 1000 books is being sold for \$40.00. The book will contain 100 photos depicting historical events and people through McCall's first 100 years. Delivery will be on July 19, 2012 at the opening of the new Centennial Park.

The Centennial Park is the second of the significant projects. Situated between Fogglifter Cafe and My Father's Place restaurant on one of the premier corners in McCall, the Centennial Park will be a main tourist attraction and remembrance of McCall's past. The brainchild of committee member David Armstrong, the park has taken on a life of its own. Luke Vannoy of McCall Design has done a rendering and site plan that are quite beautiful, and are on the city website.

The park will consist of a 100-foot meandering art project that will depict significant events of McCall's first 100 years. Many local artisans will contribute to the artistic presentation of these events. It will also be a place for people to sit and eat lunch or just enjoy views of the lake. The Centennial Logo will be prominently displayed as the focal point mounted in a large rock. At the base of the rock will be thirty to forty plaques or engraved stones honoring individuals, families, businesses, civic groups and many more that had a hand in shaping McCall's history.

The floor of the park will be brick pavers that can be purchased and engraved to honor loved ones, friends, and even pets.

There are several levels of contributions that allow you the opportunity to be part of preserving our history and honoring McCall's past. The enclosed information describes how you can be a part of this special project.
