

Historic Preservation Commission

Meeting Minutes 11/23/10

Present: Brian Corcoran, Marlene Bailey, Jennifer Theisen, Carol Coyle

Brian called the meeting to order at 1:38 pm. A quorum was present. The minutes of the July 6th, August 31st, and September 21st meetings were reviewed. Brian noted that a topic that was discussed at the August meeting was the Star News series on the history of McCall. Jennifer moved to approve the minutes as amended, Brian seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Carol gave an update on McCall's participation in the America in Bloom program. There was a great deal of positive feedback about the program and McCall will participate again next year.

Carol reported that the Certified Local Government grant for \$3500 was submitted to the SHPO. This will be to hire a consultant that will assist the HPC to determine which buildings and sites might be eligible for nomination to the National Register and to help identify historic districts in McCall.

Centennial Committee planning: Carol gave an update on the recent meeting of the newly formed Centennial committee. Marlene and Brian are interested in attending.


Sandi Hammond has moved to Oregon and Brian asked that a replacement be sought to serve on the Commission. It was suggested that local architects be contacted, and it would be useful to have someone who is familiar with the Sylvan Beach area and west side of the lake.

Walking Tour brochure: Materials were distributed for the walking tour brochure. Jennifer suggested that the aerial map not be used as it is too "busy" and suggested a hand drawn map to make it more reader friendly. It was determined that the deadline for completion of the brochure will be May 1st. Members discussed various area resource people to involve to get more information for the brochure.

The next meeting will be held January 18, 2011 in the Idaho Room in the McCall Public Library.
