

McCall Historic Preservation Commission

Meeting Minutes 1/18/11

Present: Brian Corcoran, Marlene Bailey, Bob Fairbrother

Brian called the meeting to order at 1:35 pm. A quorum was present. Brian asked to amend the agenda to include a letter of interest from Ann Braak. The letter was distributed and members reviewed her resume. Brian will call Ann to discuss the Commission.

Brian mentioned that there is some incorrect information on the naming of McCall on Wikipedia. He suggested that a clarification be sent to Wikipedia including the minutes of the Boise County Commissioner's meeting of July 19, 1911. Bob mentioned that his father obtained his marriage license in Idaho City in 1917, so it was prior to Valley County's establishment. Marlene indicated that she has letters related to the incorporation of McCall. Brian suggested that the revision of Wikipedia be tabled until more supporting information could be compiled.

The minutes of the 11/23/10 meeting were reviewed. It was moved by Marlene to approve the minutes and seconded by Bob. The motion passed.

Carol updated the Commission on the Centennial Committee. The Committee has met twice and has generated a number of ideas for the upcoming celebration. Marlene mentioned that the Cabin Fever series will be upcoming and will include a presentation on the history of the Winter Carnival.

Brian discussed the Centennial article series. The January article will be on the early history of McCall. He is willing to compile drafts of each article for the members' review and edits. As he will be leaving the area for the winter, much of the work will be done via email. Members discussed various topics and volunteered to research them.


The draft of the walking tour brochure still needs to be completed. It was suggested that it could be distributed at the Museum and at the Chamber, as well as City Hall.
