a.) Boating Ambassador

The boating Ambassador has just finished off his season. Cameron worked a total of 138 hours and worked 21 days. He recorded 803 boats in the water and 241 boats out of the water. He reported 332 jet skis in the water and 114 out of the water. He also reported 2515 people going into the lake and 869 people coming out of the lake. We are very proud to have Cameron work for us this summer. He was professional, informative and friendly. Everyone I have spoken too including City Council noticed some improvement at the docks thanks to the Boating Ambassador. This was a great success thanks to the support of the community, city council, the city grant writer, carol coyle, staff and the advisory committee.
