VISION:

The vision of the McCall Area Pathway Master Plan is to plan and develop an integrated pathway network that includes trails and pathways interconnected throughout and adjacent to McCall and connects users to forest recreation opportunities. The Green Network pathway system will connect and enhance McCall's unique mountain community cherished by generations for its scenic beauty and the small town quality of life.

GOALS:

- Develop a McCall Area Pathway Master Plan
- Involve key partners and the community in the planning process and in developing the pathways system
- Improve connections and safety within communities, such as between parks, schools, recreational areas, public buildings, neighborhoods, etc.
- Provide non-motorized access to forest recreation.
- Increase recreational opportunities for people of all physical abilities
- Increase tourism dollars and improve economic development
- Improve wellness, health and fitness with multiple non-motorized modes of transportation
- To provide maps and information to the public about McCall area pathways and their community benefits
- To promote respect for private property along the pathways to minimize disruption and disturbance
- Provide alternate transportation options for McCall area residents and visitors
- Reduce traffic congestion and air pollution
- Establish community involvement in the development and maintenance of the McCall Area pathway system

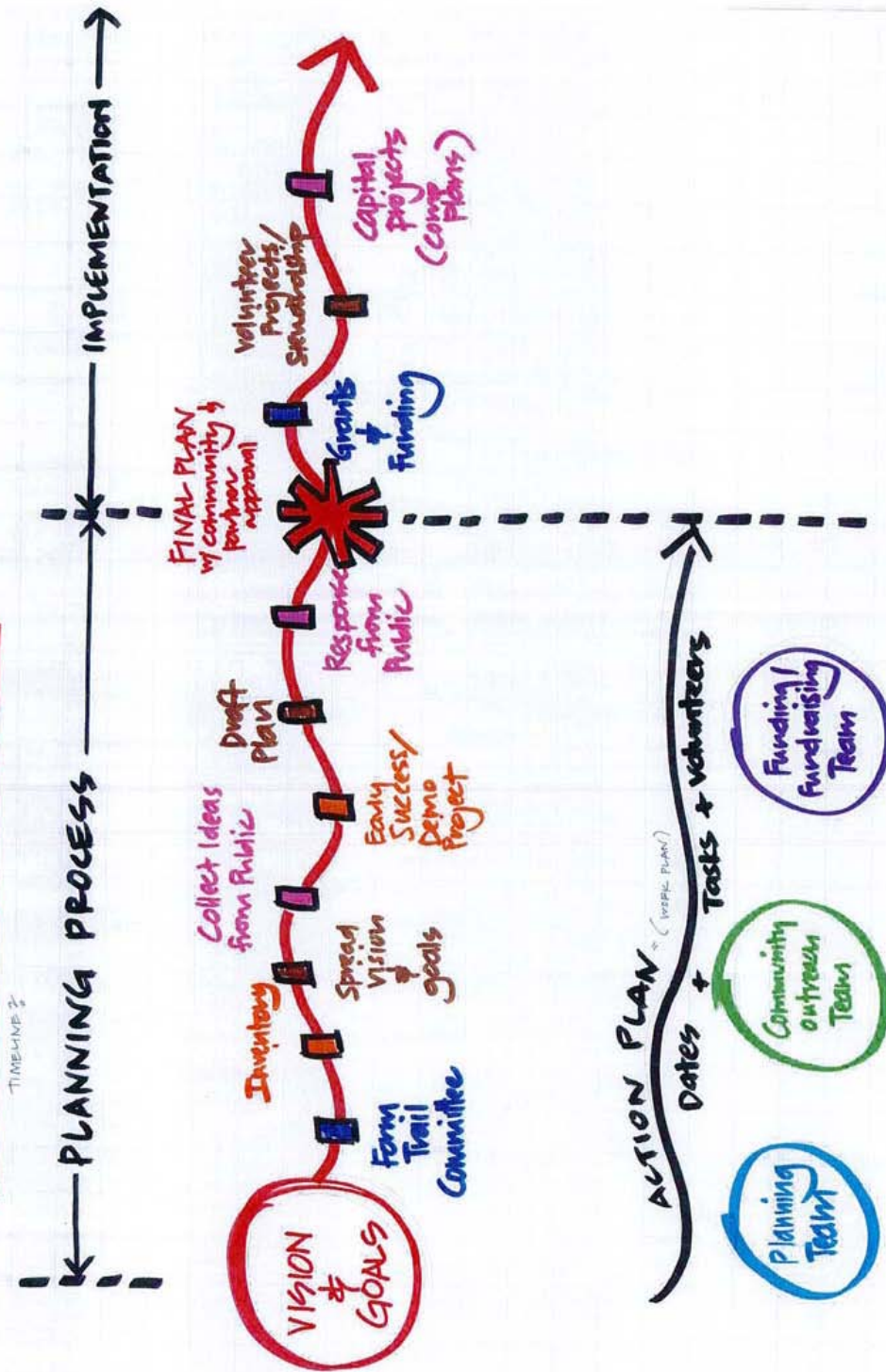
