Employment Guidelines for the return of workers to essential service businesses

If your industry is considered essential (<https://coronavirus.idaho.gov/essential-services/>) please adhere to the following guidelines from Central District Health when onboarding your employees:

- If employees or people are coming to the area from areas with community transmission of COVID-19, they should isolate/shelter in-place for two weeks before working.
- Once they begin work, look for opportunities to work safely:
 - Schedule work to minimize contact with others
 - Emphasize respiratory etiquette and robust hand washing
 - Be diligent about identifying illness symptoms quickly and isolating symptomatic individuals
 - Limit the sharing of tools when possible
 - Consider safe transportation to and from the jobsite; carpooling as we know it is not safe; maintain 6 feet of separation
 - Consider wearing cloth face coverings according to CDC guidelines
