To the City of McCall Council:

I am writing with an urgent request. Since last week, we have seen documented cases of COVID19 in McCall and Valley County increase dramatically. We now have community spread here which means that the Coronavirus is actively spreading among our citizens. This was, not unexpectedly, brought to us by our Summer residents, visitors, and seasonal workers. We are working diligently to contain the spread of the virus. The spot fires of infection that we are seeing risk growing into a wildfire such as happened in Blaine County Idaho in March. If that happens, we risk overwhelming our hospitals and negatively impacting the health of our community. SARS CoV2 has proven to be a highly contagious and dangerous pathogen. Asymptomatic and pre-symptomatic spread of the virus is now well documented and creates great difficulty identifying and quarantining the infected. Distancing, avoiding crowds in indoor spaces, the use of face coverings, hand hygiene, and isolating the sick are all we currently have to fight the virus. These measures work to dramatically reduce its spread when they are strictly adhered to.

To that end, I am requesting that the City of McCall Council convene to immediately create a city government mandate requiring masking in all indoor public spaces in McCall. With the anticipated influx of visitors to Valley County for the Independence Day long weekend, the need for this is urgent. Voluntary compliance and recommendations are proving ineffective at getting people in public spaces in McCall to do the right thing. I have included the ordinance for Summit County Utah regarding mask use in public as an example of what local and county governments can do. The web address for their policy is below. They discuss the issue of enforcement in their web site, which I understand is of concern. Governor Little, in his press conference last week, explicitly stated that local governments have the authority in Idaho to create such legal mandates to promote public safety.

I urge you all to seriously consider the health and lives of our citizens and mandate mask use in all public spaces. I am available at any time to discuss this request personally with any of you. The need is urgent. The time to act is now.

Seward, 'at the precipice' of a major COVID-19 outbreak, cancels Fourth of July celebration

Amid spiking coronavirus cases in the scenic city on Resurrection Bay, Seward chamber of commerce officials on Monday canceled Fourth of July events this coming weekend.

The cancellation includes fireworks and vendors in addition to the already canceled Mount Marathon Race and parade. The events annually draw thousands of visitors from a wide part of the state, tripling Seward's 2,750 year-round population.

[2020 Mount Marathon Race canceled due to COVID-19 concerns]

As of Monday, 18 Seward residents had tested positive for COVID-19, including eight new on Sunday, after an outbreak began there late last week, according to the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services COVID-19 dashboard. Another 3 cases were reported in nonresidents there, including two new cases Sunday.

The city last week advised anyone who had visited the Seward Alehouse and Yukon Bar earlier in the week they should be tested for the virus. A Seward Alehouse employee tested positive for COVID-19 and the restaurant posted it would close for cleaning and to monitor employee health. Hundreds of tests were performed over the weekend.

Many restaurants and bars downtown were closed Monday and numerous people were waiting to get tested, according to Kat Sorensen, a chamber spokeswoman.

Sorensen said she hoped no one was planning any kind of alternative activities to make up for the loss of the annual festivities.

"We are at the precipice of our COVID outbreak," she said Monday.

The Seward Chamber of Commerce had originally hoped to proceed with the holiday events using mitigation measures such as social distancing, face coverings handed out to participants, hand sanitizer stations and street closures to give people more room to spread out.

But the chamber, in collaboration with the city of Seward, state and local health care providers, and the chamber board and members decided instead to cancel given the recent and dramatic increase in COVID-19 cases there, according to a statement issued Monday.

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

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

Bob,

I know that you are inundated with a situation you could have never anticipated when you took office. This COVID-19 issue is difficult by anyone's standards, let alone someone who is making decisions about how the city will proceed.

I notice that the City's website is asking people to wear face coverings in public. I am writing to you to request that the city actually impose a requirement for everyone to wear face coverings in public and practice social distancing. This could be limited to when people are inside and not seated at a restaurant, and outside if social distancing cannot be practiced. This could be noticed on banners over the road at the two entry points to town.

I think people are coming to visit McCall and are totally skipping all responsible and respectful ways to visit McCall and interact with its residents. I just spoke with a Physician's Assistant yesterday in Boise, who came to McCall last weekend. He said that he thinks people are careful in their home town, but then come to McCall on vacation and fail to practice social distancing or wear face coverings. He went to Mountain Java with a mask on, and they said to him "you must be a local, you have a mask on". This is sad. Everyone should be respecting McCall and its residents, and do what they can to avoid community spread. I think, given the very busy weeks ahead, it would be worth imposing face coverings.

City Council,

As a full-time resident and business owner, I'm becoming increasingly concerned for the health of my wife and four daughters. We've been told 25+ cases of COVID have gone through our hospital in the last week with some of those folks being sent to Boise to be hospitalized yet our official counts only show 11 confirmed cases in Valley County.

I understand visitors who are sick with COVID count only in their hometowns, but if they're "recovering" here, we need to know. Where can we go to get an accurate report of the COVID risk in our hometown?

Likewise, we are increasingly unclear as to what establishments are safe to support. For example, we've been told Mile High Marina and Shore Lodge have had active cases of COVID, but there is no information posted anywhere to let us know if this is true and, if so, what those organizations have done to mitigate the risk – so, right or wrong, we are simply staying away. In fact, because this information doesn't appear to be transparently reported, we have decided to avoid all local institutions. We don't want to do this, but we have no way of knowing which businesses are safe to support (other than May's Hardware which has been requiring masks since day 1). Is there a way we can determine this so we can help our local business owners?

Finally, what steps are being taken to stop the surge in cases? My office is located above Ice Cream Alley. I've stopped using it because I can't safely navigate the path from my house on Roosevelt Avenue to my office without passing groups of un-masked, non-social distancing visitors. It seems to me the best solution for all business owners and residents is to require masks in public. If we do this, we might have a chance of reversing the surge AND keeping our economy running. It appears to offer that rare win-win solution. I fear this coming weekend – without masks we're encouraging super spreader events – which means within 30-days our hospital could be overflowing with cases and friends and neighbors may be dead.

We've been lucky so far. Now is time to take action. What actions are we taking?
