Call to Order and Roll Call Budget Work Session Adjournment

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Mayor Giles called the Special meeting of the McCall City Council to order at 9 a.m. Mayor Giles, Council Member Maciaszek, Council Member Nelson, and Council Member Thrower all answered roll call. Council Member Nielsen was absent.

City staff members present were Anette Spickard, City Manager; BessieJo Wagner, City Clerk; Sarah Porter, Deputy Clerk; Erin Greaves, Communications Manager; Linda Stokes, City Treasurer; Michelle Groenevelt, Community Development Director; Delta James, Economic Development Planner; Brian Parker, City Planner; Stefanie Bork, Parks and Recreation Business Manager; Eric McCormick, Golf Course Superintendent; Meg Lojek, Library Director; Chris Curtin, Information Systems Manager; Traci Malvich, Human Resources Manager; Dallas Palmer, Police Chief; Nathan Stewart, Public Works Director; Sean Reilly, Network Administrator; Meredith Todd, Assistant City Planner; Emily Hart, Airport Manager.

WORK SESSION

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT RELATED TO FY24 BUDGET

No comments were received.

Property Tax Allocation

- a. New Construction (90% of value) \$134,432
- b. 3% Increase \$217,531
- c. Forgone Amount \$509,513
 - i. Eligible to take up to \$73,030 for operations and maintenance.

City Treasurer Linda Stokes reviewed the levy rates for the past 5 years, the effect of the homeowner's exemption increase, and the impact of taking both the 3% increase and allowable forgone amount. City Manager Anette Spickard asked Treasurer Stokes to explain the property tax offset approved by the state legislature. Treasurer Stokes reviewed HB 292 property tax relief bill providing direct relief to homeowners. The credit will apply to those that are approved for the homeowner's exemptions. All eligible homeowners will get the same percent credit on their tax bill.

The City Council consensus agreed with the proposed property tax allocation.

Review of Personnel Costs

Human Resources Manager Traci Malvich gave a summary of personnel costs, a review of changes to insurance costs, and a review of requested positions not included in the budget. Additionally, Manager Malvich reviewed options for short-term and long-term disability benefits currently not offered by the City. Mayor Giles noted that the City Council is supportive of employee retention and benefits. Treasurer Stokes noted that the City Council can increase the contingent expenses to account for additional benefits. The City Council expressed support for adding a disability benefit.

Review of the Draft FY24 Operation & Maintenance budget worksheet & the Draft Capital Improvement Projects (CIP)

Treasurer Linda Stokes gave an overview of the draft FY24 Operations and Maintenance budget worksheet and the draft CIP. Treasurer Stokes noted all funds aside from Parks and Recreation have positive cash to pay for capital improvement projects without taking on debt. Additionally, Treasurer Stokes reviewed equipment lease changes in FY24. Mayor Giles expressed appreciation for Treasurer Stokes. Manager Spickard also expressed appreciation for staff work done during the budget process. Additionally, the City does a great job at budgeting conservatively, meeting reserve requirements and not overextending funds.

The City Council discussed grants received for CIP in FY24. Mayor Giles asked for each department to address the City Council. All departments expressed being on board with the FY24 budget and the need for additional staff as the city grows.

Council Member Maciaszek made a motion to set the tentative budget for FY24 at \$44,133,731.00. Council Member Nelson seconded the motion. In a roll call vote, Council Member Maciaszek, Council Member Nelson, Mayor Giles, and Council Member Thrower all voted aye and the motion carried.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Idaho Office of Energy Management (IOEM) has awarded a Hazard Mitigation Grant to the City of McCall in the amount of \$61,087.50 to support the costs to have a licensed engineer conduct a Tier III Seismic Analysis of the Public Works facilities at 815 N. Samson Trail. This analysis will provide data to assess the costs and scope of seismic (earthquake) remediation actions as compared to costs of reconstruction of these facilities. Seismic analysis of public facilities is listed as a "high priority" in the 2020 Valley County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan and is identified as a recommended action of the 2020 McCall Public Works Facility Master Plan.

The total estimated cost of the seismic analysis is \$67,196.25. The grant will provide \$61,087.50 and must be matched with \$6,108.75 in local funds, which are available in the FY24 Public Works adopted budget.

The Idaho Office of Energy Management Subrecipient Agreement to accept the grant award is attached.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Authorize the Mayor to sign the Idaho Office of Energy Management Subrecipient Grant Agreement for a grant in the amount of \$61,087.50 to support seismic analysis of the Public Works facility.

Assurances, Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, Representations and Certifications

FY24 Budgets

Downtown West Urban Renewal Project budgeted Total Revenue is estimated at \$275,000 and budgeted expenditure is \$517,306.

Board qualifications, Appointment Process and Bylaws

Resolution No. 01-2023 was adopted as a policy to address Board qualifications and the appointment process. There are requirements for residency as well as an appointment term change from 2 to 4 years. The Resolution formalizes the review of new candidates by the Board prior to appointment by City Council. The Board also adopted Resolution No. 02-2023 adopting the 2023 Amended and Restated Bylaws.

Brown Park Lakefront Improvement Project

The project was completed since the last Annual Report.

Downtown Benches and Trash Receptacle

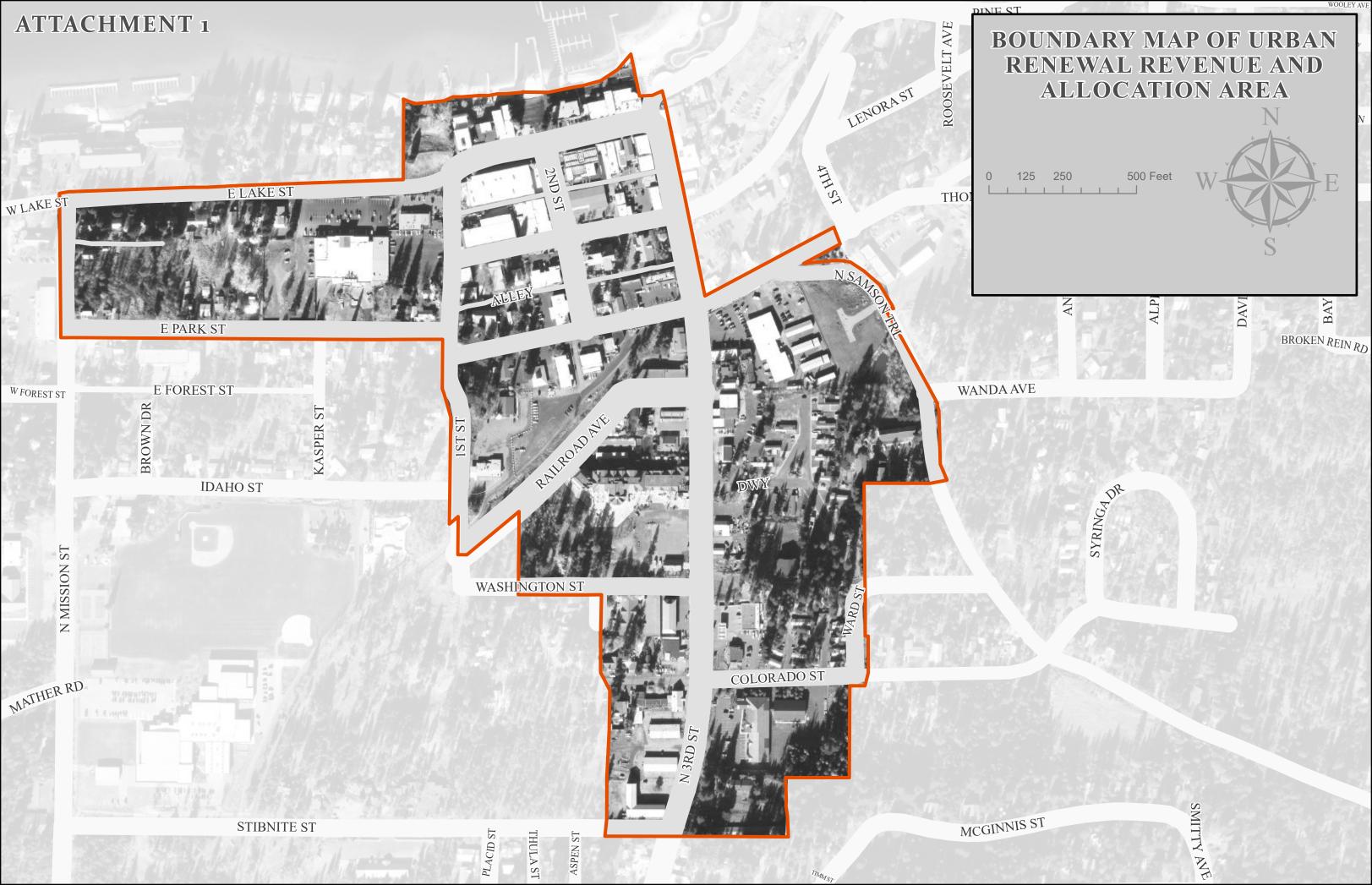
The MRA approved funding for 6 benches and 1 trash receptacle not to exceed \$22,000 for locations in the Downtown West District.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:
