While exact playground use counts have not been collected, this park and playground have been observed to be the most heavily used in the City's public park system.

The the park is free and open to the public 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. daily.

Site engineering and layout to address necessary grading, mitigate ground water and surface water conditions, finalize play structure siting, and detail pathway modifications and alignments needed for ADA accessibility. Crestline Engineers has provided a preliminary cost estimate for design and engineering (attached).
- 2. Site preparation and playground equipment purchase and installation. Complete grading, pathway realignment, tree removal, irrigation system modifications, and retaining work to accommodate ADA access and play structure placement.

Estimates from playground equipment providers and contractors assisted in developing the cost estimate for this project. After the design and engineering is complete, the bid specifications will be developed and the project will be publicly advertised for bids. The City follows Idaho Public Works Construction procurement procedures and requires contractors to hold a public works license for any project valued over \$10,000.

The primary outcome of the proposed project is to improve accessibility of Brown Park and its play area. The new play equipment and pathway modifications will be consistent with all current standards for accessibility.

The responsibility for the ongoing maintenance of Brown Park is the McCall Parks and Recreation Department. That department currently oversees and maintains 70.6 acres of public parks, five public restrooms, and 9.5 miles of City recreational pathways. The Department has seven permanent staff and eleven seasonal employees from May-October when park use is heaviest. The proposed project will upgrade and improve park facilities, but will not add additional maintenance requirements. Instead, Parks staff will be maintaining new and improved play equipment rather than trying to keep old equipment safe and operational.

The FY18 annual budget for the Parks Department for personnel is \$392,102. The annual operating budget for vehicles, fuels, equipment, supplies, irrigation, plants, trees and other items is \$195,236.

THIS AGREEMENT is between the **City of McCall - Parks and Recreation Deptartnebt**, hereinafter referred to as the "CLIENT" and Crestline Engineers, Inc., hereinafter referred to as "CRESTLINE." The CLIENT and CRESTLINE in consideration of their mutual covenants herein agree as set forth below.

The CLIENT intends to perform site improvements including reconstruction of ADA accessible pedestriaion access to the park, playground relocation and improvements, stormwater/drainage improvements, etc. at Brown Park in McCall, Idaho, hereinafter referred to as the PROJECT.

CLIENT INFORMATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES

All direct expenses will be billed at cost, plus ten (10%) percent.

Sub-Consultant Fees: Sub-Consultant fees and expenses, if any, will be billed at cost, plus ten (10%) percent.

CRESTLINE has not been retained to supervise, direct or have control over Contractor's work. CRESTLINE specifically does not have authority over or responsibility for the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of construction selected by Contractor(s), for safety precautions and programs incident to the work of Contractor(s) or for any failure of Contractor(s) to comply with laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes or orders applicable to Contractor(s) furnishing and performing their work. Accordingly, CRESTLINE can neither guarantee the performance of the construction contracts by Contractor(s) nor assume responsibility for Contractor(s) failure to furnish and perform their work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

OPINIONS OF COST

CRESTLINE may be asked to provide opinions of construction or PROJECT costs as part of the professional services under this Agreement. The CLIENT understands and agrees that CRESTLINE has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment or services furnished by others, or over the Contractor(s)' methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions. The CLIENT understands that CRESTLINE opinions of cost are based on CRESTLINE experience and represents CRESTLINE's judgment based on that experience, but CRESTLINE does not guarantee or warranty that either quotes, bids or estimates prepared by contractors, subcontractors or other will not deviate from opinions prepared by CRESTLINE. The CLIENT agrees to employ an independent cost estimator if the CLIENT desires additional assurance, warranty or guarantee of PROJECT costs.

Should the CLIENT request that CRESTLINE modify any aspect of the PROJECT to reduce construction costs, then those services shall be considered additional and beyond the scope of this Agreement unless specifically stated otherwise in this Agreement.

REUSE OF DOCUMENTS

The CLIENT agrees that no product will be reused, other than for the construction, operation and maintenance of the project, without specific written permission of CRESTLINE. The CLIENT agrees to indemnify and hold CRESTLINE harmless from any claims, damages, losses and expenses arising from unauthorized reuse of all work products prepared by CRESTLINE for the PROJECT.

COPYRIGHT OF DOCUMENTS

CRESTLINE retains the copyright to all documents and designs. The CLIENT agrees to limit the use of the documents to the specified project and that no product will be reused, other than for the construction, operation and maintenance of the project, without written permission of CRESTLINE.

GOVERNING LAW

Unless otherwise provided in an addendum, the law of the State of Idaho will govern the validity of this Agreement, its interpretation and performance, and remedies for contract breach or any other claims related to this Agreement.

SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

CLIENT and CRESTLINE each is hereby bound, and the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives of CLIENT and CRESTLINE are likewise bound to the other party to this Agreement, in respect of all covenants, agreements and obligations of this Agreement.

Nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than CLIENT and CRESTLINE, and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole and exclusive benefit of CLIENT and CRESTLINE and not for the benefit of any other party.

BILLING AND TIMES OF PAYMENTS

CRESTLINE shall submit monthly invoices for services rendered and for project related expenses incurred. If CLIENT fails to make any payment due to CRESTLINE for services and expenses within thirty (30) days after receipt of CRESTLINE's invoice, the amounts due to CRESTLINE will be increased at the rate of 1% per month from said thirtieth day, and in addition, CRESTLINE may, after giving ten days' written notice to CLIENT, suspend services under this Agreement until CRESTLINE has been paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses and charges.

TERMINATION

The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty days written notice. Such termination shall be based upon substantial lack of performance by the other party under the Terms and Conditions of this Agreement when said substantial lack of performance is through no fault of the terminating party. If this Agreement is terminated by either party, CRESTLINE shall be paid for services rendered and for project related expenses incurred to the date of such termination plus an allowance for demobilization costs as determined by CRESTLINE.

LIMIT OF LIABILITY

The CLIENT and CRESTLINE have considered the risks, rewards and benefits of the PROJECT and CRESTLINE's total fee for services to be rendered under the Agreement. In light of those factors, CLIENT agrees that, to the fullest extent permitted by law, CRESTLINE's total liability to the CLIENT for all loss, damage, harm, expense, direct or indirect loss or detriment, from any cause or causes arising out of or relating to the PROJECT or the subject matter of this Agreement shall be the sum of the total amount of CRESTLINE's fees whether such claim be based upon CRESTLINE's alleged negligence, errors and omissions, breach of contract, breach of warranty or otherwise; said limitation of liability shall be inclusion, and not exclusion, of all attorney's fees, expenses, expert witness fees and expenses, and costs of suit.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Any claim, dispute or controversies arising out of or in relation to the Agreement shall be subject to mediation as a condition precedent to arbitration. The CLIENT and CRESTLINE shall share mediation cost equally. If mediation fails to bring resolution, matters still in question shall be decided by arbitration in the State of Idaho. Both mediation and arbitration shall be held in a neutral location. Agreements reached shall be enforceable as settlement agreement in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

RECOVERY OF DISPUTE RESOLUTION COSTS


Majority of survey respondents were local year-round residents, 83.78%, 9.91% Seasonal residents, and 6.31% visitors. 85.9 % have Children or grandchildren who use Brown's park and 14.41% do not. Most visit the park a couple times a week or at least every other week.

Community members would like to see new equipment due to minor injuries/splinters from the current wood equipment. However, they would like to the location of the playground stay as is and not move to the north side of the park. The two most popular playground designs were Play Worx –Header at 63.89% and Robbins Park Tree, 52.94%.

Additional features park goers would like are: more benches, tables, toddler friendly area, handicap accessible, removal of woodchips, Keep swings/ more swings, splash pad, climbing wall/exercise equipment, a natural playscape, shade covers, a leash free dog area, shelter for equipment so it can be accessed in winter, shelter for tables/events, improved walkway, larger beach and easy put-in for water recreation, and many more suggestions listed in comments supplied by survey takers. All comments have been categorized on the PDF.



SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The City of McCall Parks and Recreation Department is seeking approval for submittal of an Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation (IDPR) Land and Water Conservation Fund grant in an amount not to exceed \$160,000 (exact grant request TBD) to support the purchase and installation of a new playground, engineering costs and ADA accessibility improvements. Public hearings and surveys for these improvements have been done. All proposed plans reflect those comments and or concerns. The survey results are attached.

City staff have budgeted for \$135,000 in CIP funds to be used as match funds for this grant opportunity as it is only available on certain years for small/local governments. The \$135,000 in combination with in kind city labor on this project will position the application to have a 50% or more match contribution. This will greatly increase the odds of being awarded grant funds. IDPR administers funds for the Lands and Water Conservation Fund throughout the state. The City has applied for and received IDPR funding in the past, most recently in 2015 to improve the City boat launch and access ramp. If the grant is awarded, future Council action will be needed to approve the grant agreement.

The McCall Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, Valley County Waterways Advisory Group, and the McCall Urban Redevelopment Agency are aware of the project and have submitted letters of support. Staff are currently working with Crestline Engineering to ensure this phase of the overall projet works with long term infrastucture needs and plans. Future improvements slated to take place along the waterfront to the South have also been considered and accounted for as we move forward with this project. An excerpt of the Playstructure plan is attached.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Approve submission of an Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation Land and Water Conservation Fund grant application and authorize the Mayor to sign all necessary documents.

The CLIENT understands that CRESTLINE opinions of cost are based on CRESTLINE experience and represents CRESTLINE's judgment based on that experience, but CRESTLINE does not guarantee or warranty that either quotes, bids or estimates prepared by contractors, subcontractors or other will not deviate from opinions prepared by CRESTLINE. The CLIENT agrees to employ an independent cost estimator if the CLIENT desires additional assurance, warranty or guarantee of PROJECT costs.

CLIENT and CRESTLINE each is hereby bound, and the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives of CLIENT and CRESTLINE are likewise bound to the other party to this Agreement, in respect of all covenants, agreements and obligations of this Agreement.






BROWN PARK PROJECT SITE

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





Brown Park Data Report for Playground Improvement


Majority of survey respondents were local year-round residents, 83.78%, 9.91% Seasonal residents, and 6.31% visitors. 85.9 % have Children or grandchildren who use Brown's park and 14.41% do not. Most visit the park a couple times a week or at least every other week.

Community members would like to see new equipment due to minor injuries/splinters from the current wood equipment. However, they would like to the location of the playground stay as is and not move to the north side of the park. The two most popular playground designs were Play Worx –Header at 63.89% and Robbins Park Tree, 52.94%.

Additional features park goers would like are: more benches, tables, toddler friendly area, handicap accessible, removal of woodchips, Keep swings/ more swings, splash pad, climbing wall/exercise equipment, a natural playscape, shade covers, a leash free dog area, shelter for equipment so it can be accessed in winter, shelter for tables/events, improved walkway, larger beach and easy put-in for water recreation, and many more suggestions listed in comments supplied by survey takers. 

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The City of McCall Parks and Recreation Department is seeking approval for submittal of an Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation (IDPR) Land and Water Conservation Fund grant in an amount not to exceed \$160,000 (exact grant request TBD) to support the purchase and installation of a new playground, engineering costs and ADA accessibility improvements. Public hearings and surveys for these improvements have been done. All proposed plans reflect those comments and or concerns. The survey results are attached.

City staff have budgeted for \$135,000 in CIP funds to be used as match funds for this grant opportunity as it is only available on certain years for small/local governments. The \$135,000 in combination with in kind city labor on this project will position the application to have a 50% or more match contribution. This will greatly increase the odds of being awarded grant funds. IDPR administers funds for the Lands and Water Conservation Fund throughout the state. The City has applied for and received IDPR funding in the past, most recently in 2015 to improve the City boat launch and access ramp. If the grant is awarded, future Council action will be needed to approve the grant agreement.

The McCall Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, Valley County Waterways Advisory Group, and the McCall Urban Redevelopment Agency are aware of the project and have submitted letters of support. Staff are currently working with Crestline Engineering to ensure this phase of the overall projet works with long term infrastucture needs and plans. Future improvements slated to take place along the waterfront to the South have also been considered and accounted for as we move forward with this project. An excerpt of the Playstructure plan is attached.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Approve submission of an Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation Land and Water Conservation Fund grant application and authorize the Mayor to sign all necessary documents.

The proposed project will replace outdated and failing playground equipment and make the play area accessible to children of all abilities, which it currently does not accommodate. As the attached letters of support demonstrate, this site is heavily used and well-loved. The proposed improvements will offer these same opportunities to generations to come.
