Idaho noxious weeds are plant species that have been designated “noxious” by State law in Idaho Code (title 22, chapter 24).

McCall City is home to at least 10 noxious weed species.

Why should you care about Noxious weeds?

- They crowd out many beneficial native plants, which harms the many natural animal species that are dependent on them and directly impairs natural beauty.
- They destroy native ecosystems and reduce opportunities for hunting, fishing, camping and other recreational activities.
- They destroy important wildlife habitat.
- They can have a direct impact on land value. Lands infested with noxious weeds often have restricted uses.

How can you help?

- Early detection is key! Learn how to identify noxious weeds and report sightings.
- Take action to prevent the movement and spread of noxious weeds.

KNOW WHAT YOU GROW!

Manage noxious weed infestations on your property and never plant species on the noxious weed list.

KNOCK IT OFF!

Noxious weeds can hitch a ride on vehicles, equipment, clothing, shoes, and even your pets. Make sure to properly dispose of all seed and plant material before leaving and/or entering each area you visit.
