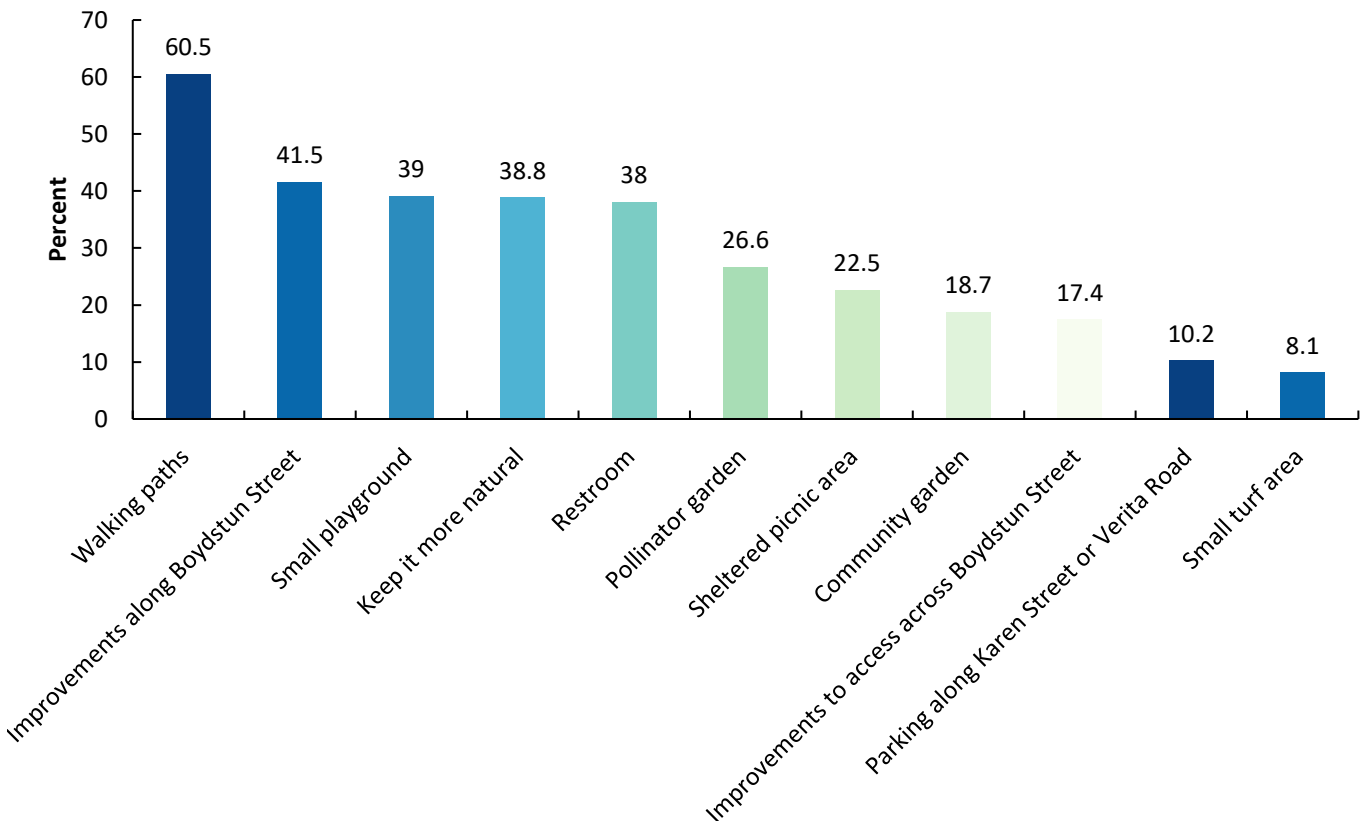

## Poll 1: Neighborhood Parks Results

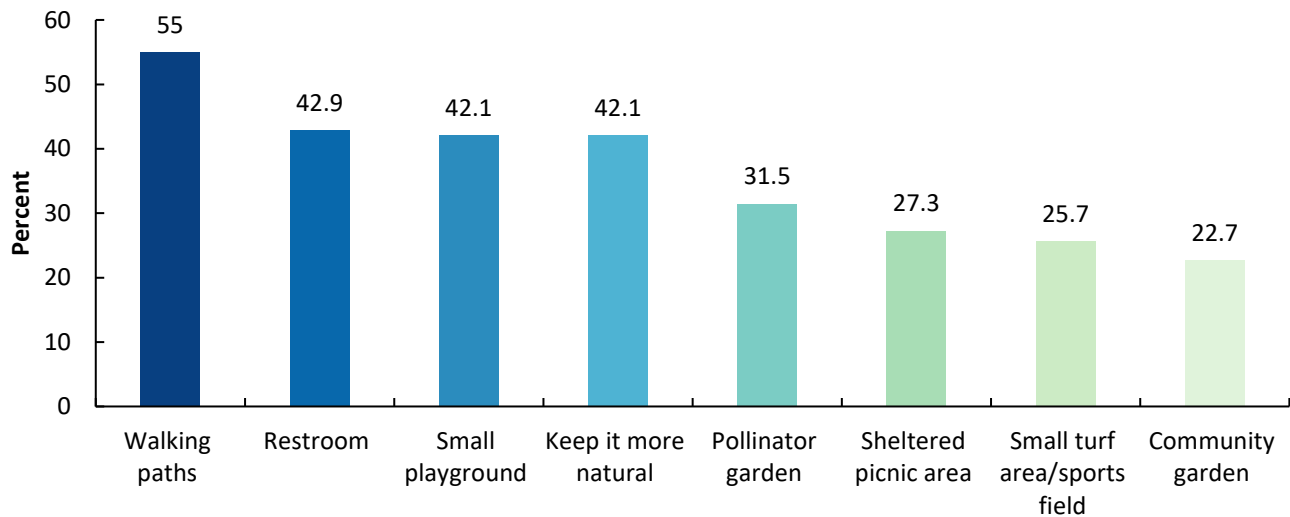
### Broken Ridge

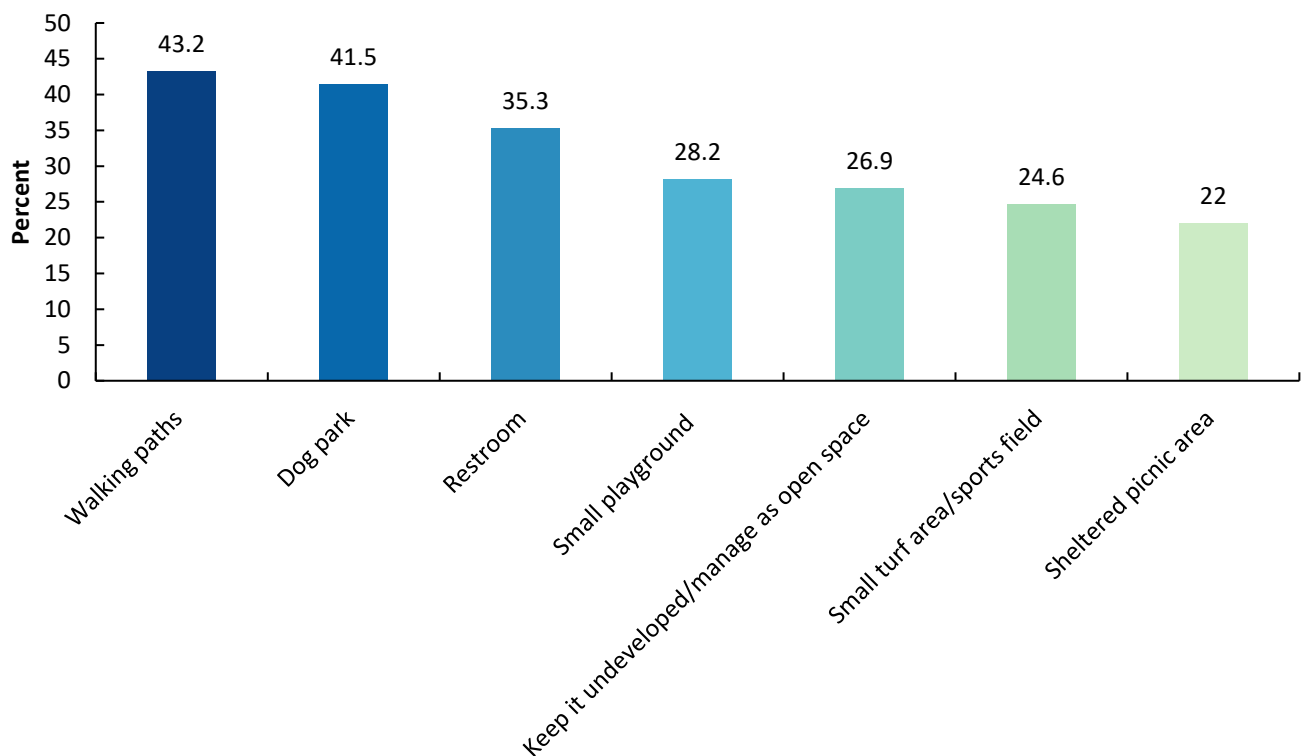
## Lick Creek

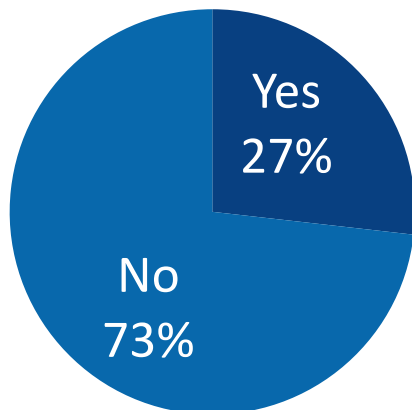
## Colorado Street

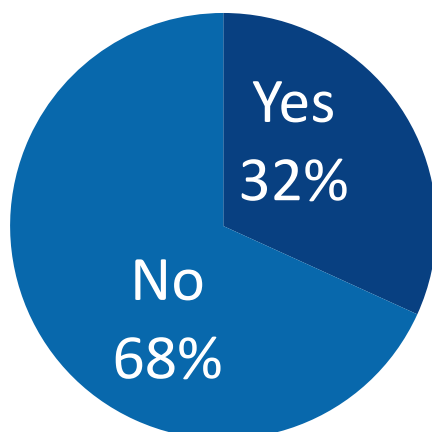

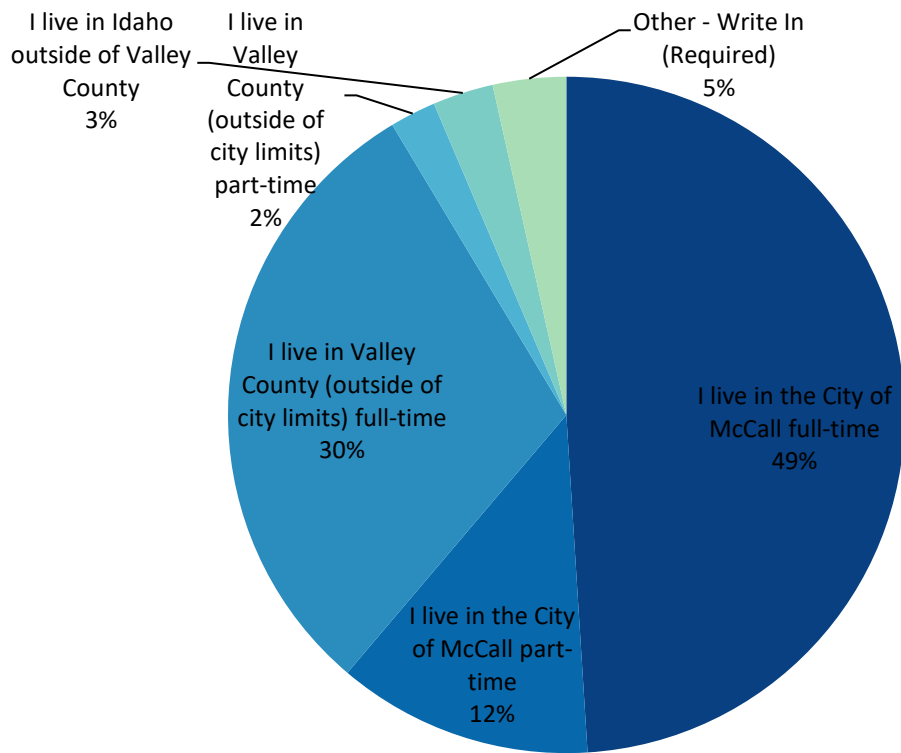
1. What is your level of support for (or would you use) for the facilities that are shown on the Riverfront concept plan?

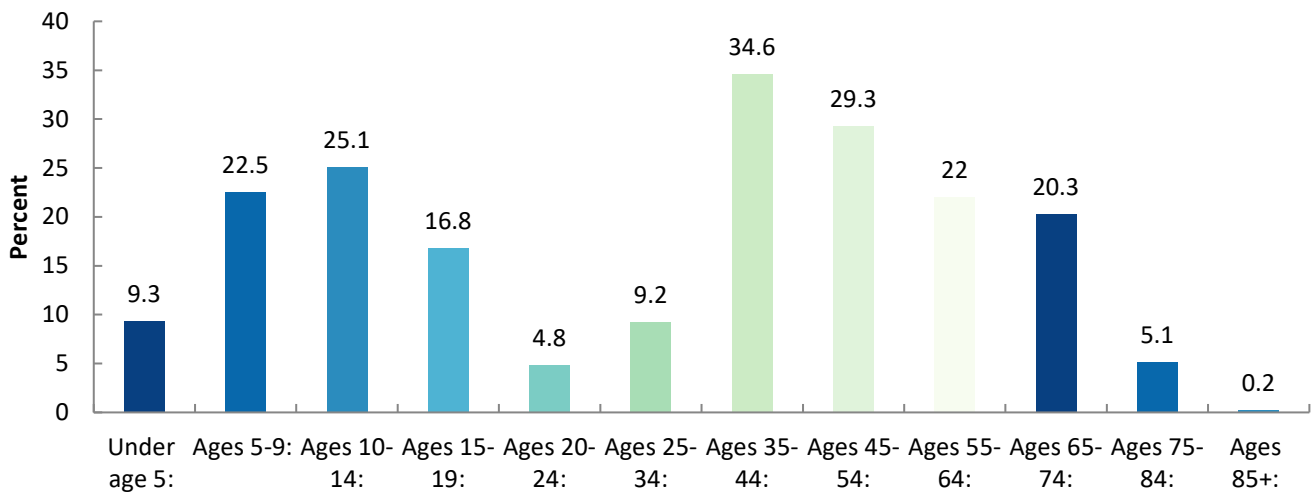

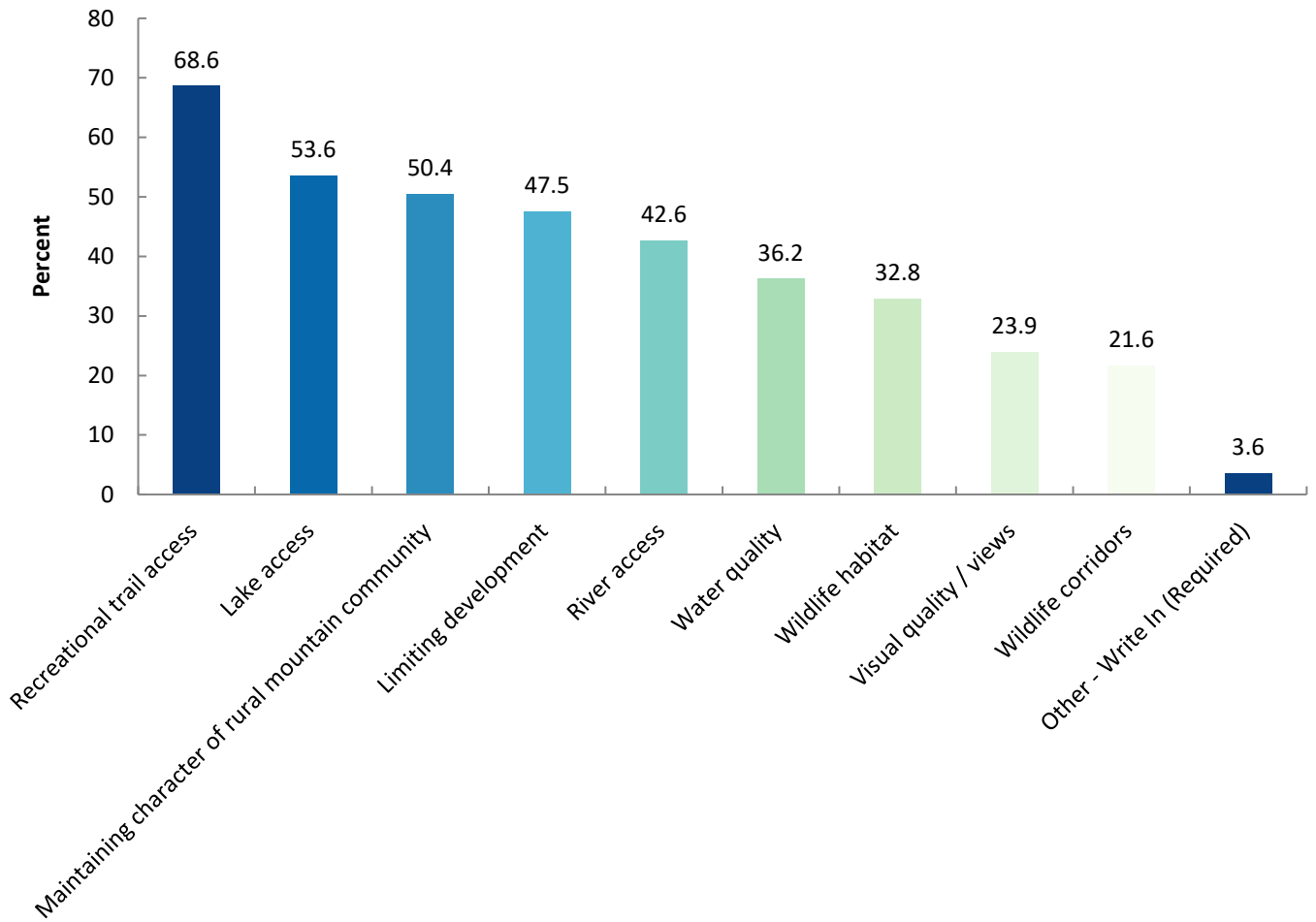

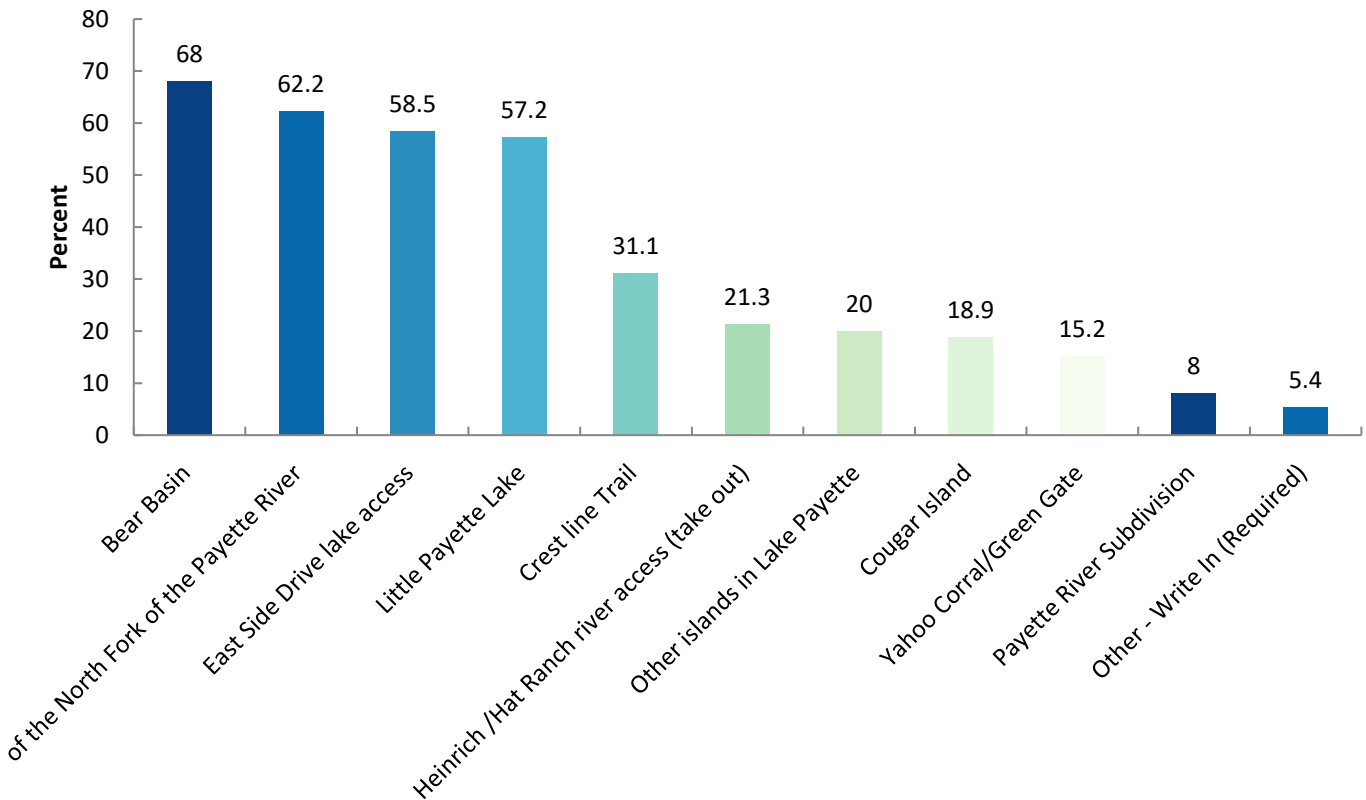


# Poll 3: Pathways and Regional Connections Results

**2. What open spaces/public lands around the City of McCall are most important to connect to from the city and protect as open space for recreational access? (Select your top four priorities)**



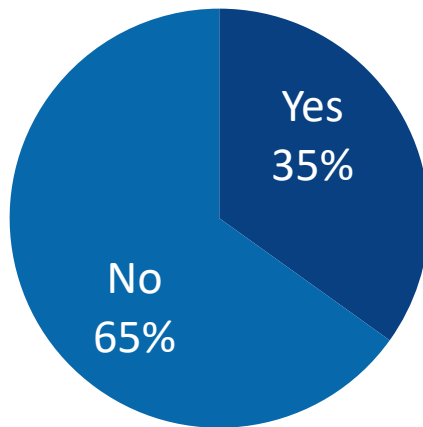

- KEEP PUBLIC ACCESS PUBLIC!!!

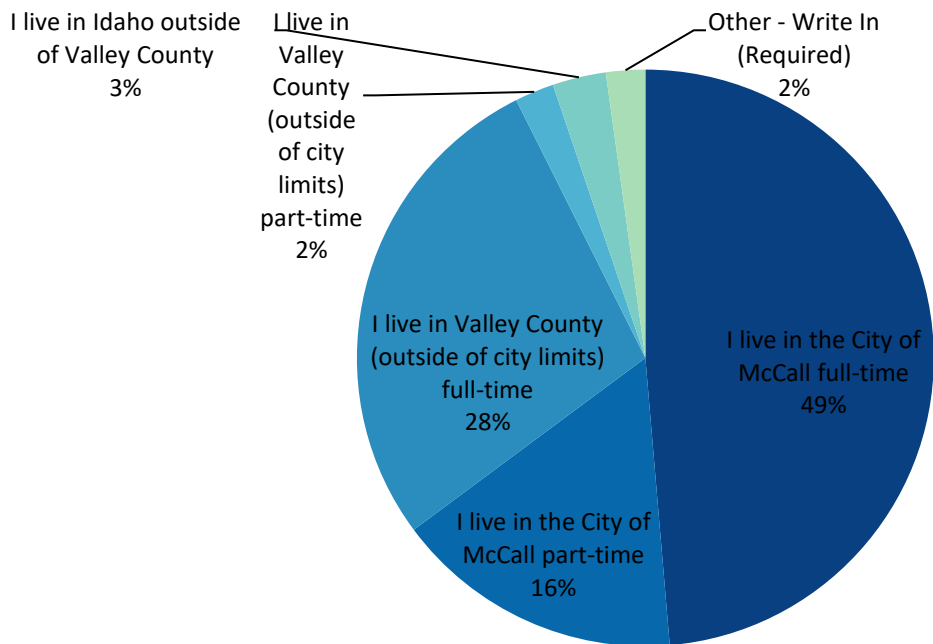


- New Payette Lake trail (Eastside)

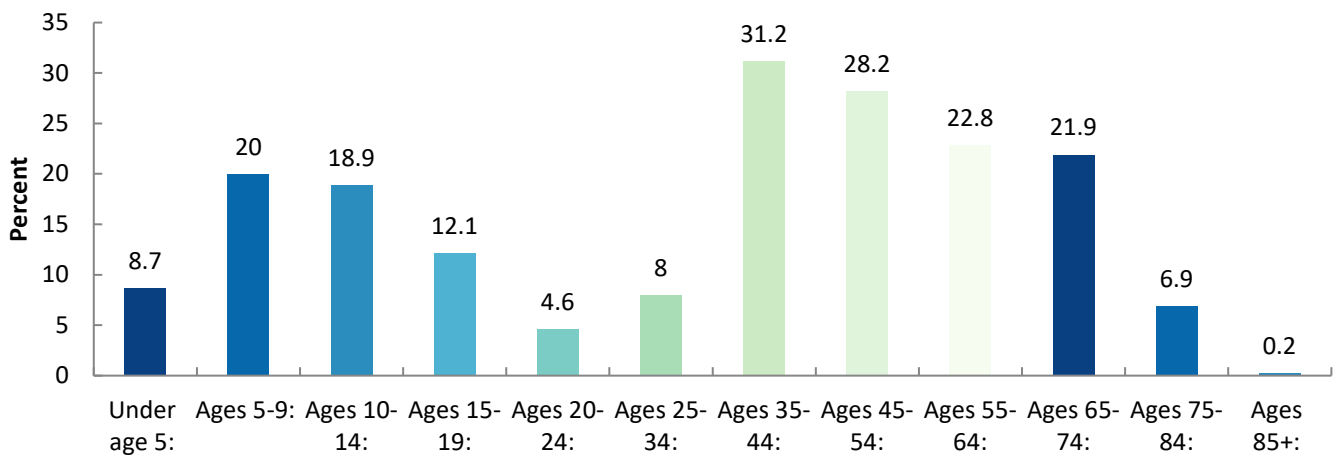

## Poll 1

- Multi use fields and activities areas needed for kid and youth
- McCall needs a ref center for kids. Inside the ref center an indoor walking track is needed for seniors and people who struggle to walk in the winter!
- McCall is surrounded by nature and many outdoor opportunities, parks are wonderful but the cost to maintain additional facilities should be lower priority than infrastructure. Please make our sewer upgrades and road maintenance the priority instead of building picnic tables, restrooms, pickle ball courts, etc. A multilevel parking structure on the city lot on 1st street would be money well spent to improve the tourism experience here and provide much needed parking. Use one of these other city properties for snow storage.
- sidewalk or bike trail along Wooley. What is there is great but once off the boardwalk it is so dangerous. also a boardwalk from Brown park to downtown
- Rec and aquatic center! Indoor soccer! This community needs more winter options please
- I sure wish the city would continue to think in terms of dog friendly open spaces. As the golf course has become less dog friendly, the lake access more limited to dogs, it would be nice to expand areas for dogs to be able to play and run - especially during winter months when forest access is more challenging.
- Would so love to see a rec center with a pool.
- It looks like your question for Colorado Street Park amenities may be for the Riverfront Park site (river access?).
- How about another dog park somewhere in McCall by the water. I know about the dog fenced area behind the senior housing, difficult to get to. The area currently designated between the Marina and Brown's Park is unusable from late September until late Spring and very difficult to access in the summer now that Brown's Park has been remodeled and taken part of the dog area away. Since every other area or park around the lake is designated NO Pets! it would be great if you could make this one area nicer and more accessible for seniors and everyone else. It has to be shared with swimmers and boats so it can't really be called a dog park.
- Frisbee Golf & Ping Pong tables needed
- The connection of all parks with the current shared use path is ideal and should be considered. Exercise stations along the walking paths in the park would be great. Similar to what Avimor did. Dog stations for those who are irresponsible would be nice too, then we can have a clean walking path.

- Any extension of bike access off of streets would be excellent. I also like additional bike parks/flow trails in these spaces
- Connecting pathways for bikes and pedestrians are a critical part of City of McCall. I believe a lot of time and effort going towards that would be very beneficial. Thank you
- Perhaps we could just not make more parks? If we continue adding them then maybe change our name to Park City 2
- Please make the maps in the poll more interactive as I could tell where the Colorado Street park was with respect to Highway 55 and street names I knew.
- The downtown could be better if benches we installed
- Safe walkable community, more playgrounds, and family-friendly community spaces.
- In initial phases, I'd recommend natural surface walking trails in all those locations. It would be good to clearly delineate them as parks and public space because they feel like they're part of the adjacent private property. People need to feel welcome to use the space without feeling like they're trespassing.

- Really wanting a rec center with a good indoor walking arena for those of us getting older can walk safely in the winter without falling on ice. It's a big risk for those of us getting older
- Aquatics and Rec center, please! We are way too big of a community to not have one. It's embarrassing that we don't have this basic amenity available for our kids. So instead, since there's nothing else to do on a long winter night, they just party. Give the youth something to do at night!
- There are no public pickleball courts in McCall. The private courts at Aspen, Spring Mtn and Woodlands are full much of the summer.
- I live right across the street from the Colorado parcel on Samson Trail. I'm all in on making that parcel a park. I'm not excited about having buildings there though. Not that big and parking would likely impact our little street. It would seem to fit a playground and maybe a dog park. There are lots of kids that walk by on their way to and from school. - PLEASE plan for maintenance of parks. It was disappointing to see the beautiful plants and grass go into Brown Park, and then there was zero maintenance on what was planted. The weeds grew to 5 feet in parts of the new grass. I spent an hour or two weeding myself when my kids played there.
- Bike pump track, paved path around for roller blades/bikes, splash pad
- You say the Colorado Street park will be on top of a landfill- if this is just fill dirt, obviously no problem. But if there's anything potentially toxic, please make sure it's a safe place for a park before planning further.

- Bike/pump tracks along with walking paths - keep the natural habitat for less landscaping and water use. Picnic tables for use but permanent shelter not necessary....just keep the trees!
- Parking for these developments needs to be incorporated onto the parcel being developed and not on city roadways. Save some natural areas to help manage snow removal, storage from city roads as we currently haul it out of downtown and need spaces like these to manage storage for other public areas. We have terrific outdoor natural spaces and we don't need to overdevelop city parks causing large ongoing operational costs in budgets. Keep things simple and multi use and plans can grow as needs change.

I love the idea of community/pollinator gardens with a walking path through them as well as creating a better walking/biking path through town. The more natural we can keep these the better, in my opinion

It's an accident waiting to happen. Davis from Wooley to Lick Creek needs a bike lane! Also - please finish the bike lane on Wooley from Davis to the wood trestle just before Spring Mtn Ranch road. Again, a safety issue in summer months. I would welcome the bike lane improvements, not only for myself, but for all the visitors that come to McCall in the summer time.

- We need better dog access to the lake on the west side. Rotary park is completely unused in the off season and mornings. People who clean up after their dogs should be allowed to swim dogs there. I would suggest a pass/ permit system like the bear basin Nordic system uses for dogs to encourage accountability and reinforce that this is a privilege that can be taken away.
